Rebranding UCP's website with accessFlow



United Cerebral Palsy (UCP) is a national nonprofit serving over 200,000 individuals with cerebral palsy and other disabilities. For its 75th anniversary, UCP set out to refresh its national website — ensuring it reflected both its legacy and its commitment to accessibility.

The Challenge

To mark this milestone, UCP found a web agency to:

- ✓ **Deliver an inclusive user experience** for thousands of individuals and families relying on UCP resources.

The solution: accessFlow

As a seasoned nonprofit partner, UCP integrated accessFlow, accessiBe’s developer-first accessibility platform, into the website build.

With accessFlow, the web agency was able to:

- ✓ **Audit** the site with automated scanning across pages, elements, and user flows
- ✓ **Prioritize** critical user journeys with visualization tools that made complex issues easier to understand.
- ✓ **Fix** recurring accessibility issues using guided code examples.

During implementation, the web agency provided feedback that helped accessiBe refine features and improve accessFlow for future businesses looking to advance their accessibility.
