



Overview

A VPAT helps organizations conform to the law while opening the door for businesses to sell to government agencies. It is a compliance tool that helps your company grow as well as shows where it stands from a web accessibility viewpoint.



What is a VPAT?

VPAT stands for Voluntary Product Accessibility Template. It's based on the WCAG or Web Content Accessibility Guidelines and it assesses a website's accessibility.

It's designed to comply with the legal requirements outlined in **Section 508**.

What is an ACR?

The "T" in VPAT stands for Template. Once the template is filled out, it becomes an ACR or Accessibility Conformance Report.

So the difference between the two is the VPAT is the empty form, while the ACR is a completed VPAT.

Do I need a VPAT?

If any of the following applies to your organization you require a VPAT.



U.S. government agencies (Municipal, State, and Federal)




Agencies under government contract



Organizations that receive U.S. federal funding (Universities, Healthcare companies, etc...)




WCAG level

Our VPATs are carried out in compliance with the WCAG 2.0 AA guidelines, which reflect today's best practices surrounding accessibility standards. The **Description** section also outlines the overall accessibility of the website in question.

Terminology

Supports indicates an accessibility level that meets the WCAG standard. **Partially Supports** is an indication that only some functionality meets the WCAG standard. Finally, **Does Not Support** lets the reader know that most of the functionality does not achieve the WCAG 2.0 AA standard.



How do you determine your pricing?

Will a VPAT help me make my website more accessible?

A VPAT/ACR is more of a compliance tool that will give you a general sense of the overall accessibility of your website rather than a detailed audit that could guide an accessibility improvement initiative.



Do I need to fix all of the issues listed in my VPAT/ACR?

In most cases, the minimum requirement is to have an up-todate completed VPAT/ACR, though some government agencies now require VPAT/ACRs that show at least partial accessibility for every criterion.

Industry best practice is to run an Expert Audit first, make the suggested accessibility improvements to your website, and then run the VPAT to generate an ACR that shows how accessibility is a strength of your organization and a competitive advantage.



Are there any tax incentives associated with these expenses?
